  - Tribe/Company/Organization Name(s)
- This contest requires access to ArcGIS Online (AGOL) to create a story map. Tribal GIS Members have access to AGOL, please contact us for information about requesting access.
- Conference registration and attendance is required.
- Check with Tribal GIS to ensure your story map link is received.
  - You will have the option to include a URL link when registering online (255 maximum characters).
  - You may also email your story map URL link to [events@tribalgis.com](mailto:events@tribalgis.com).
- Judging will be conducted on April 25 through April 27 at noon by the NTGISC conference committee and other professionals.
- 1st, 2nd & 3rd places will be given for Best Story Map Submission. Winners will be announced during the closing session on Thursday, November 21. You do not have to be present to win.
